LEE'S SUMMIT WEST HIGH SCHOOL



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SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

The 117-square-mile Lee's Summit R-7 School District serves one of the prime growth areas of greater metropolitan Kansas City. Approximately 18,506 young people attend 18 elementary schools, three middle schools, and three high schools. Our district operates an Early Childhood Center, a Parents As Teachers program, Summit Ridge Academy, and Summit Technology Academy.

POST-SECONDARY PROFILE

Lee's Summit West High School was established in 2004. The graduating class of 2017 had approximately 65.4% who entered a four-year college or university with another 24.1% choosing a two-year college or technical school. 2.9% indicated that they would be joining the work force. 3.3% planned to enter the military and 4.3% were undecided.

CLASS RANK/GRADE POINT AVERAGE AND GRADING SCALE

All grades are included in the computation of the grade point average that is computed on a traditional four-point system. Courses taken in the Advanced Studies program receive extra weight in the grading system. Ninth and tenth grade students enrolled in the Advanced Studies courses receive a weighted value of .50 on a 4.00 scale. Eleventh and twelfth grade students enrolled in IB/AP courses receive a weighted value of 1.00 on a 4.00 scale. Eleventh and twelfth grade student enrolled in dual credit or honors courses receive a weighted value of .666 on a 4.00 scale.

TEST PROFILE

For the 2016-2017 school year, 500 seniors participated in college admission testing by ACT. The overall senior mean English score was 22.8, mean Math score was 22.0, mean Reading score was 23.1, mean Science score was 22.3 and mean Composite was 22.7. All scores were above the State ACT Composite average of 20.4.

ADVANCED STUDIES PROGRAM

Lee's Summit West High School is one of only nine schools in the State of Missouri that is authorized to offer the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program. The IB program is designed to meet the highest standards of academic excellence in the world. It offers a rigorous pre-university course of study that is modeled after the best elements and practices of various national education systems. Successful completion of the program earns the student a diploma recognized for university admission throughout the world and for course credit and advanced academic placement and standing at over 430 leading colleges and universities in the United States. Lee's Summit West also offers an International Baccalaureate Career-Related Certificate.

In addition to the IB program, Lee's Summit West High School students have the opportunity to participate in the College Board's Advanced Placement (AP) Program. Some classes are offered for dual credit through a cooperative arrangement with the University of Missouri-Kansas City, the University of Central Missouri and the Metropolitan Community Colleges. College credit is offered for students in: Technical Writing; College Credit English; Calculus; Human Anatomy and Physiology; various IB classes; Art Portfolio; the fourth and fifth years of modern language in French, German, Spanish and Mandarin Chinese; and various classes in Family and Consumer Sciences Program and Business.

172 students took 372 tests for International Baccalaureate, including 20 diploma recipients. In addition, 37 students tested for Advanced Placement.
